PROJECT PORTFOLIO

Cultural BEES

Creative Europe COOP-2 January 2024 – present (36 months)

A flagship initiative in the InnoEUsphere project portfolio designed to nurture entrepreneurship within the Cultural and Creative Industries (CCIs) among young people. Drawing inspiration from the Junior Achievement “Inspire–Prepare–Succeed” model, the project targets 15–18-year-old students and 18–30-year-old young adults, equipping them with the skills, knowledge, and tools to succeed in CCI careers and ventures. Cultural BEES develops and implements a comprehensive training programme and digital toolkit through face-to-face workshops, self-paced online learning, and vibrant virtual communities.

EDU4FOOD

Erasmus+ KA220-YOU February 2024 – present

Dedicated to fostering sustainability within the food sector through education. Aligned with the EU’s Farm to Fork Strategy, the project equips young learners, youth workers, and educators with essential knowledge and tools to embrace sustainable practices.
